







EADERSHIP AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAMME FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS.

The Race4Good™ Schools League is a student leadership programme unlike any other, bringing together teams from around the world to take part in a series of ground-breaking races. **Each team, comprising of students and international business leaders,** competes to develop sustainable uplift plans that will change lives, forever.

In our increasingly volatile, uncertain, complex, and ambiguous world, **leadership** and **entrepreneurship** have never been so important to young people as they are today. The Race4Good (R4G) provides a cross-curricular, interdisciplinary-focussed, skills-based programme which mirrors how students prefer to learn and interact and advances personal and interpersonal development through experiential learning.

Through a fast-paced, online race format, teams are given a specific number of days or weeks to research real-life issues facing a carefully-chosen community and to develop business plans to provide life-changing economic uplift. Supported by international business leaders, who provide vital mentoring and support, students are encouraged to step out of their comfort zones and immerse themselves in a completely unfamiliar world – from a remote community in the Himalayas to a nomadic tribe in Morocco. As teams progress, they tackle ever-more complex issues, including healthcare, infrastructure, design, education, and water harvesting, in addition to developing plans to economically uplift specific families, develop cooperatives, and improve life in the wider community.

This is not a paper exercise – winning solutions are implemented within days, enabling students to see the immediate impact of their hard work and dedication. In addition, the race is run completely online so students don't ever have to leave their bedrooms or classrooms to change lives, forever!

Through the race's emotional content, students are able to develop a broad range of leadership and life skills that go beyond academic success, including **extreme empathy**, compassion, problem-solving, team building, business planning, **creativity**, public speaking, and **emotional intelligence**.



GET IN SHAPE: CREATING FUTURE LEADERS

- Preparation: Prior to the Race4Good, year groups limber up with guided access to the Future Leaders Courageous Leadership programme.
- Modules: 'Who Are You?' and 'See Life Through Their Eyes'
- Goal: To stimulate self-awareness and cultural reflection.



THE RACE: LEAVING A LEGACY

- The R4G League: There are three knockout rounds; starting with 2 weeks of dynamic challenges and exercises.
- Time to compete: Year groups will be stretched and challenged and learn how to thrive as they work with their peers and business mentors. Year groups will use all the resources to tackle real-life issues.*
- Sustainable economic business plans are submitted at the end of each round.
- A judging panel that includes the challenged community, reviews all plans for each round.
 All successful year group challenges are implemented.

MAINTAIN FITNESS: EMBEDDING LEADERSHIP


- The Finish Line: This is just the beginning as the year groups have continued access to the Future Leaders Courageous Leadership programme.
- · Modules: The Power Of You.
- Goal: To integrate the learning into dayto-day life.



*Resources include: the local Race4Good team, community elders (youth, women, men), and expert advisors versed in local economics, politics, religion, and agriculture.






The budget for all challenges is intentionally limited as experience has shown us that success lies in applying innovation, intelligence, and empathy to a problem.

RACE HUBS

Race Hubs will be created across the year group to capture the interests and skills of students and channel their expertise in tackling Mid-Race Challenges and in shaping the final business plan and presentation. Students can volunteer to join one or more Race Hubs, depending on their skills, passions, and interests.

BUSINESS MENTORS:

Each Race Hub will be allocated a **Business Mentor. Meeting** virtually, business mentors will share their entrepreneurial skills, expertise and industry knowledge and support Race hub volunteers and activities. Business Mentors will be selected from a widerange of departments and functions to ensure maximum impact for all students.
