Brighton College Abu Dhabi is a new school which opened in September 2011. It is an independent British curriculum school linked to Brighton College UK, the Sunday Times School of the Year for 2012. It caters for children from age 3-18, and consists of three distinct sections. The Pre-Prep School takes children from age 3 - 7, the Prep School takes children from age 8 to 13, and the Senior School takes children from 13-18.

In 2012-13, the College began GCSE courses for the first time, and in 2014-15 A level teaching began with our first cohort of Sixth Form pupils
